formance, ably accompanied by Mrs B. McRae at the piano.

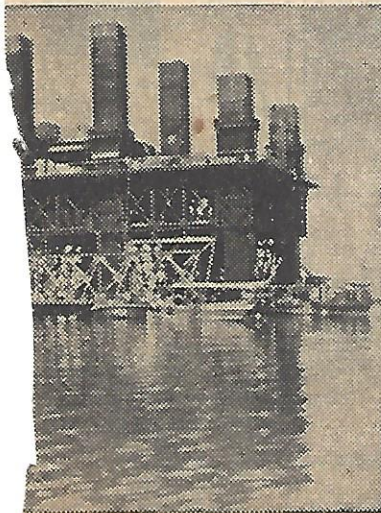
